- 1. SIZE, COMPOSITION AND EQUIPMENT:
 - A. COMPOSITION: 9 TNL, 1 USN
 - B. SPECIAL ATTACHMENTS: NONE
 - C. COMM AND OBSERVATION EQUIP: 3 PRC-25'S
 - D. SPECIAL EQUIPMENT: 1 M-79, 4 CLAYMORES
- 2. MISSION: TO MET AS REDIO RULLY FOR THAM'S TEXAS PRETE AND VEAL STWAND BY THE ARED TO CALL AND ADJUST AIR/ARTY ON ALL TARGETS OF OPPORTUNITY.
- 3. TIME OF DEVARTURE AND RETURN: 171430H/221200H
- 4. ROUTE: SEE ATTACHED OVERLAY
- 5. SYNOPSIS: THIS PATROL COVERED A PERIOD OF 118.5 HOURS WITH 1 SIGHT-ING OF 1 VC AND 1 INCIDENT OF SMELLING SMOKE. THE TEAM WAS EXTRACTED ON 181140H UNDER MODERATE SMALL ARMS FIRE FROM AN UNKNOWN NUMBER OF ENEMY AND WAS REINSURTED 181200H WITHOUT INCIDENT. THE TEAM WAS INSURTED BY HELICOPTER AND WAS EXTRACTED BY THE SAME MEANS. NO SUPPORTING ARMS WERE USED. THE TEAM HAD ENEMY RADIO STATION ON SAME FREQUENCY TEXING TO IMPURSONATE TAKE OUT AND X-RAY CONTINUOUSLY THROUGH OUT THE PATROL. ENEMY RADIO STATION REPEATEDLY ASKED FOR TEXAS PETE'S AND VEAL STEW'S POSITION.


A. ENIMY:

1717OOH VIC. ZC102649 TEAM SIGHTED 1 VC VEARING BLACK PJ'S, CARRINING AK-47 AT SLING ARMS. ENEMY APPEARED TO BE A SENTRY ON POST. TEAM STARTED TO MOVE OUT OF THE AREA WHEN THEY SMELLED SMOKE COMING FROM THE DIRECTION FROM WHICH THEY WERE MOVING. THAM TOOK NEGATIVE ACTION AND MOVED OUT, OF THE AREA.

181140H VIC. ZC104646 TEAM WAS BEING EXTRACTED WHEN HELICOPTER TOOK MODERATE SMALL ARMS FIRE FROM AN UNKNOWN NUMBER OF ENEMY IN A 360 DEGREE PERIMETER AROUND THE EXTRACT LZ.

- B. TERRAIN: AFFA WAS GENERALLY ROLLING WITH 80-90' CANOPY AND SECONDARY GROWTH OF 6-8' CONSISTING OF THICK VINES, BAMBOO VINES 1-1/2'' IN DIAMETER, 6-8' HIGH BRIAR BUSHES, LARGE BOULDERS, SMALL SHRUBS AND SMALL TREES. MOVEMENT WAS DIFFICULT AND THERE IS WATER IN THE AREA.
- 7. OTHER INFORMATION: INSERT AND EXTRACT LZ VIC. ZC126653 GOOD 1 CH-46, CONSISTING OF OLD FIRE SUPPORT BASE WITH HARD DIRT SURFACE. APPROACH INTO LZ IS FROM S TO N. TRAIL: TRAIL VIC. ZC105648 RUNNING NE-SW, 1-2' WIDE AND PRESENTLY BEING US'D. OP: OP VIC. ZC126653 PROVIDES GOOD OBSERVATION TO THE N, NE, AND E AND IS HASILY DEFENDABLE BY 25 MEN. COMM: COMM WAS ONLY FAIR WITH X-RAY AND RIO GRANDE DUE TO POOR WEATHER.

- 9. OCCIDITION OF PATROL: GOOD, WITH 1 NBC (CELLULITIS OF RIGHT HAND)
- 10. CONCLUSIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS: PATROL LEADER FIRMLY BELIEVES THERE IS A BASE CAMP IN THE VIC. Z0102649 DUE TO THE TRAIL ON WHICH THE VC SENTRY WAS WALKING BEING HAEVILY AND WELL USED.
